Guy Nixon and Robert Castle, former members of staff, and Mrs Guy Nixon. Brief obituaries appear below:

Robert Castle (died 13.01.01)

Robert was born in China in 1915, where his parents were missionaries. After education in England including a BA degree at Cambridge, he joined the RAF during the Second World War. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for his services, which included time with the highly trained Pathfinder Force.

He taught at Elizabeth College from 1946 and commanded the CCF. He then rejoined the RAF, and was awarded a bar to his DFC for service during the Christmas Island atomic bomb tests.

He returned to teaching in England in 1961 and eventually settled into retirement in Dorset. His third wife Anne died only eight days later, after nearly 40 years of marriage.

Guy Nixon (died 12.03.01 aged 92)

Guy Nixon was educated at Eton and Cambridge. He served in the Merchant Navy during the Second World War and came to Elizabeth College in 1945 as Head of Modern Languages at a time when much reorganisation was necessary. He was Housemaster of Town House for many years and took an active part in the Games Programme.

He was Treasurer of the Shakespearean Society, amongst many other interests.

He lived in King's Road for much of his life in Guernsey, and was a keen member of the Royal Commonwealth Society in his long retirement.

Notes

Sir Peter Le Cheminant (3946) has published a memoir of his distinguished career in the RAF. He served from entry to Cranwell in 1938 until his retirement as Air Chief Marshall in 1979. He was later appointed HM Lieutenant Governor in

1985, but his book concerns his service years, flying many different aircraft in various parts of the world, starting with the Second World War and including Korea and Malaysia. He also held important posts with NATO and other Western defence alliances, and these form part of his highly interesting account of an outstanding career.

Peter Keeling (5017), who first worked in banking in Africa, joined the Bank of Bermuda in 1980 and has now completed 20 years' service.

Roy Wales (5105) was a very successful Adjudicator at the Guernsey Eisteddfod this year. His worldwide experience in choral and instrumental music took him to Jersey last year.

Howard Mauger (5181) is working as an independent financial advisor and has contributed a series of articles to the Guernsey Press.

As Headmaster of the Guernsey Grammar School, **Dennis Balls** (5207) had a considerable struggle to maintain the school's existence, although it has been so successful under his and **Alan Bisson's** (4741) previous leadership, the States were finally convinced to maintain the present arrangements while improving the quality of the other secondary schools.

Peter Wilson (5210) was again successful with his latest speedboat, Condor Lucky Seven. He set two new world records including endurance for three hours. He already holds the one hour and two hour records.
